In 2017, Simone received a commencing PhD scholarship in honour of Yvonne Aitken from the Graduate Women of Victoria, and later won the Queen's College Three Minute Thesis competition, presenting her research on expressive musical gesture in contemporary flute performance.

Two performance highlights of the year were: receiving an invitation to perform a classical flute recital at the Central Queensland Conservatorium of Music, Mackay (QLD), and performing in the world premiere of Tim Dargaville's 2014 Albert Maggs Award commission *Between Breath and Word* at the Melbourne Recital Centre, which was recorded and later broadcast on ABC FM.

Simone also competed in national and state classical music competitions. She was the only flautist amongst eight musicians in the semi-final of the Australian Youth Classical Music Competition, held in Geelong, and in July, she received second prize for the Victorian Flute Guild's Senior Flute Competition.

In addition to being regularly sought out as a classical performer, Simone also pursues performance and research of new music. In September, she was selected to attend the Bendigo International Festival of Exploratory Music Writer's Workshop to work with leading music critics and produce her own concert reviews for publication on the contemporary music blog *Partial Durations*.
